Plan Your Trip

On April 15th, all permit reservations for the peak summer season, May 15th through October 15th, will become available through Recreation.gov. Camp area availability is updated in real time and no sites are reserved for same-day walk-in permits.

The PNT passes through two "quota areas" shown in gold, the Sol Duc/Seven Lakes Basin and the Ozette Coast. Permits are limited in these popular areas; permits are not limited elsewhere along the PNT.

The Recreation.gov website is a convenient way to reserve an advance permit for a quota area or a short trip. If you need a permit to traverse the PNT, or if you need a high-mileage permit that requires traveling more than 15 miles between campsites, contact the Port Angeles WIC for assistance.

To assist PNT hikers who are unable to reserve an advance permit online, WIC staff will assist them in making permits by phone. Call at least 48 hours before your intended start date. It may take up to 24 hours to return your call during the peak season.
